Indicators for the Hospitality Industry

KEY INDICATORS

- Hotel guest is vague with reservation information
- Hotel stay is for extended time with few possessions/luggage
- Requests room close to exits/stairwells
- Multiple rooms purchased or requests multiple adjacent rooms
- Payments are made in cash or pre-paid credit cards
- Excessive foot traffic in and out of room by non-guests at all hours of the day
- Room guests infrequently leave hotel room
- Room occupant waiting in hallway by exit door permitting non-guests to enter
- Occupant of room (male or female) routinely seen waiting in hallway, lobby, or frequently sitting in vehicle of parking lot
- Non-registered visitors waiting in parking lot or seen loitering by hotel room doors/exterior entrances
- Males or females loiter in or around hotel
- Regular use of "Do Not Disturb" sign
- Refusal of cleaning services
- Room contains drug odor or possible drug use
- Multiple mobile devices in room
- Items in room may include provocative clothing, lotions, used/unused condom wrappers, sex paraphernalia, and key cards from other hotels
- Complaints of excessive noise, arguments, and/or fighting
- Refusal or failure to register vehicle upon checking in hotel

POTENTIAL VICTIMS

- Signs of physical abuse (burns; scars), sexual abuse, branding/tattooing
- Avoids eye contact, fearful, anxious, in psychological distress
- Inconsistent/rehearsed stories; lack of knowledge about location, date, or other general information
- Exhaustion, malnourishment, substance abuse, unkept provocative clothing
- Controlling occupant referred to a "daddy" or "madam"
- Does not have control of identification or money

Note: Indicators are **not all-inclusive and does **not** necessarily indicate an individual is being trafficked or is a trafficker if one/more of the indicators are observed above.*
